Strategic Planning

Completed September 2019 – February 2020

Purpose:

To enhance the quality of life of and ensure that all children in Southington are healthy and ready to learn.

Target Age of families served:

Programming from birth to entry into kindergarten
Resource-sharing related to children from birth to grade 5



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All children are healthy and prepared for school.

Trends Identified During Strategic Planning

- Longtime residents see this as solidly white, middleclass community
- Increase in Racial and Ethnic Diversity
 - Increase in number of students needing English Language services (and at higher levels)
- Increase in Poverty Levels

vs. 1853 for sum of babies born 2014-2018.


Increase in number of children per household


Southington – ALICE

Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed Households that earn more than Federal Poverty Level but less than basic cost of living for the area.

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Trends Identified During Strategic Planning

Mental health needs are increasing (anxiety, depression, understanding of trauma)

- Need for trauma-informed care and social emotional learning training for childcare providers
- Decline in Empathy
- Decline in Self-Regulation



Trends Identified During Strategic Planning

Dependence on electronic devices (smartphones, tablets, computers)

- Impact on kindergarten readiness due to decrease in parents reading to children
- Decrease in Gross Motor Skills
- Decrease in Fine Motor Skills

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Mental Health Insights - SPD

Mental Health Distress Related Calls for Service (calendar year):

- 2019: 300 calls for service 25 calls per month.
 2020: 264 calls for service 22 calls per month
 2021: 110 calls for service year to date, 22 calls per month year to date

These numbers are specific to mental health distress type calls, they <u>do not include</u> Domestic or Family Violence situations.

Death by Overdose (calendar year):

- 2019: 10
- 2020: 12
- 2021: 04 year to date (5/24/2021)

Note: These are updated from what was shared during the live present

Domestic Violence Served by Prudence Crandall Center

<u>Time period</u> Adults and children served <u>Units of service</u>

4/1/2019 – 3/31/2020 174 from Southington 539

4/1/2020 – 3/31/2021 203 from Southington 643

(COVID period) (+29 individuals) (+104 units)

Service delivered to these clients include court advocacy, shelter, counselling, safety planning and info/referrals



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

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Pandemic Impacts on K Registration

- For 2019-2020 year, 453 K students
- For 2020-2021 year, 428 K students
 - Down by only 25
 - There were 13 few babies born in 2016 (372) vs. 2015 (385)

For 2021-2022 registration 48 had no preschool experience.



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Trends Identified Around Childcare: A Crisis

- Space Availability
- Staffing and Regulations
- Caregivers work long hours, low wages
- Costs driven by adult-child ratios



What Does Childcare Cost?

- Nursery Schools
 - Age 3-5: \$146-310 per month, PT, 2-3 days/week
- Centers
 - Infants/Toddlers: \$200-\$265 per week FT
 - Preschool: \$150 -\$245 per week FT

FT Childcare costs = In-State UConn tuition



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Care4Kids

- A state childcare subsidy for low-moderate income families if working or, temporarily, in training.
 - Now: less than 50% of the State Median Income (SMI), family of 4 = \$60,300
 - Plan under American Rescue Plan Act to increase that SMI %
- Care4Kids family fees will be waived from 4/1/21 to 9/30/21 under Coronavirus relief package
- Only 100 Southington Children enrolled (as of 2/21)
- Encourage people to apply.

Women-owned small businesses owned run out of their homes. Licensed, registered and inspected. Must meet training requirements. Limited to 2 infants and up to 6 pre-school age, plus school age.

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Other Pre-School Experiences - Free

- Family Resource Center of Southington
 - Classes for children age 1 to 5 with an adult
 - Six-week sessions, year round
 - Currently mix of online and smaller classes
- Southington Library
 - Variety of children's programs currently online
 - Children's Department needs more space Upcoming Referendum

Covid Pandemic Impacts on Childcare

- Health Concerns Staff and Families
- Restrictions on Class Size
- Cohort Limitations
- Cleaning Requirements
- Increased Financial pressure



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Provider Survey - Staffing

Seven of 10 providers are hiring.

- "We advertised online and in the newspaper for staffing. As with many business looking for employees, there are hardly any responses."
- "We have both full time and part time positions open in our toddler and preschool areas. We have been looking for staff for about two months."
- "..we've pretty much been dealing with finding good staff to fill these roles for about a year."
- "We always have a need for substitutes.. very difficult to fill those part time spots."



Provider Survey – Concerns

Concerns seen in children and families:


- Behavioral Issues (8 of 15)
- Family financial issues unemployment, etc. (5 of 15)

Concerns of business/staff:

- Stress levels (9 of 15)
- Impact of the past year on children (8 of 15)
- Vaccine hesitancy (8 of 15)
- Impact of minimum wage increases (6 of 10)
- Financial viability (6 of 15)
