
Birth to Three in Southington


Birth to Three supports families when they have concerns about their children's development.




















Economic - Southington


- Children living in poverty: 434 of 9746 (under 18) -2021
- Homelessness: 21 students (PreK-12) 2022-23
- Children without health insurance: 65 (under 18) -2021
- Percent of Households Paying 30% or More of Gross Income on Housing: 25% overall, 48.7% renters -2021

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A Crisis with Childcare: Parents

- High Cost
- Space Availability
 - Better than a year ago for some ages
- Waiting lists
- Staff turnover impact's child's attachment
- Health concerns



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A Crisis with Childcare: Providers

- Staffing shortage
 - Per CAHS Early Childhood Providers survey, 3,800 staff openings in CT spring 2023, down from 4,440 last year.
- Pay long hours, low wages, minimal benefits
 - Minimum wage increased to \$15 on June 1
- Increased Financial pressure
 - COVID relief State and Federal funding will not continue
 - State support in budget not as much as requested.



Insights from Childcare Providers

- Many of new children had not been in a childcare/preschool program prior due to Covid.
- More social/emotional challenges.
- More behavior issues.
- Extra support from outside agencies is limited with waiting lists and shorter time allotted.
- Teachers are stressed as they try to do their best in difficult situations.





How the Pandemic affected the Transition to Parenthood:

- Limited support groups; no in-person groups
- Travel restrictions, infection & prevention protocols limited family visitors
- Public health protocols ceased home-based programming (ie; Early Intervention, Home Visiting)





Mental Health


- Stillbirths increased during pandemic
- PMADs
 - Pre-pandemic15%
 - During/post pandemic 30-64%
- Maternal depression and grief symptoms interfered with baby bonding
 - Increase substance use among parents
 - Less treatment resources for parents were available
- Trauma and Loss
- Formula shortage



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

- Federal Build Back Better
- Childcare for Connecticut's Future
- State budget requests
 - Funding for childcare providers
 - Increased Care4Kids eligibility and subsidies
 - Funding for local collaboratives and Parent Cabinet
- Governor's Blue Ribbon Panel on Childcare



Outreach
